Why is there a 41-week school year in 2024? - A reminder ...

While the school year is usually 40 weeks long, every now and then there has to be a 41-week year, as is the case in term 4, 2024.

The Department of Education School Holidays Policy (<u>https://education.qld.gov.au/about-us/calendar/school-holidays-policy</u>) states that:

"Queensland state schools provide for 40 school weeks each year, with the rare exception of a 41-week year on a cyclical basis".

Important Information for Week 11 of Term 4

The Department of Education has provided guidance to schools regarding Week 11 (9 - 13 December). During this week, depending on the number of students attending, children may be supervised in different classrooms and may not be with their regular class teacher. This flexibility allows our staff to dedicate time to important work on the Australian Curriculum Version 9 and prepare for the 2025 school year.


Key points to note:

- 15 November is the final date for Year 12 attendance (Week 7 Term 4)

- 22 November is the final date for student attendance in Years 10 and 11 (Week 8 Term 4)

- Earlier this year, the Minister for Education acknowledged that the 2024 school year includes 41 weeks of student attendance, while typically the school year is 40 weeks (excluding students in Year 10 -12 as per points above).

- From next year, all Queensland state schools will be required to implement the new Australian Curriculum Version 9.



- To support this transition, the Minister and the Department have advised that schools may deliver an alternative program during the final week of the school year.

- While our school will remain open during Week 11, we are planning a program that will allow teachers to collaborate and develop high-impact learning units for the new curriculum.


Further details about the Week 11 program and our dates for key transition activities, including celebrations, concerts, and graduations, will be shared over the coming weeks.


Our attendance goal for each student remains at **95%**. Regular attendance is crucial for academic success and overall development. Students who attend school regularly:
