The Online Safety Amendment (Social Media Minimum Age) Act 2024 will introduce a mandatory minimum age of 16 for accounts on certain social media platforms, in December 2025.

Year 12 Biology Students Shine in Field Work Experience

On Monday 17 March 2025, our Year 12 Biology students took part in a significant component of their IA2 Student Experiment Assessment—an immersive field work day at the stunning Springbrook National Park. Under the expert guidance of staff from the Numinbah Valley Environmental Education Centre (NVEEC), a Department of Education facility, students visited four diverse ecological sites, gathering data for their scientific investigations.
