As we move through the middle of Term 2, we continue to be proud of the way our students are showing up—engaged, curious, and kind.

Term 2 is an important term in that all of our students will be going through assessment tasks in readiness for report card writing. Bearing this in mind, it is timely to remind all of our families regarding the importance of attending learning each and every day. School absenteeism is linked to student performance, and we certainly value teaching and learning here at Whites Hill State College.

Whites Hill State College works consistently towards achieving an attendance rate of 95% (or better). We sincerely thank all families for your support and look forward to seeing all of our students at school each and every day. Our school encourages all parents and members of our community to support us in improving student attendance.

The State Government attendance program – Every Day Counts – has four key messages:

- all children should be enrolled and attend school on every school day
- schools should monitor and create ways to improve attendance in schools
- attendance is the responsibility of everyone in the community
- children may find themselves in unsafe situations if they choose not to attend or skip school.

While most students attend school consistently, there are a small number of students who are absent from school without an acceptable reason and this may adversely impact their education. Going shopping, visiting family, staying up late and being tired or extending school holidays are not acceptable reasons to be away from school. Research shows that if your child has a record of good attendance, they are more likely to achieve in the future.

If your child is away, you need to let our school know the reasons either beforehand or on the day. You will receive notifications if your child is absent from school as per legislative requirements. We ask that should you receive a contact from us; you contact the school to explain the absence either by phone, text, email.

Thank you for the important role you play in supporting your child and helping build a strong, respectful school community.

A Reminder About Conduct on School Grounds

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all families that schools must be safe places for students, staff, and all members of our community.

At WHSC we are committed to ensuring our school remains a safe, respectful and inclusive environment for all. As part of this commitment, I remind all parents, carers, and visitors of their responsibility to behave in a manner that upholds the values of the Department of Education's <u>Parent and Community Code of Conduct</u>.

This means communicating respectfully with staff, students, and other parents, using calm and constructive language—even when raising concerns. Aggressive, abusive, or intimidating behaviour—whether verbal or physical—has no place in our school community and will not be tolerated. This includes behaviour directed at staff, students or other members of the school community, whether on school grounds or at school events.

All visitors to the school must follow reasonable directions from staff, and it is expected that interactions on our site reflect the standards we model for our students: respect, responsibility, and courtesy. Where behaviour falls short of these expectations, the school will take appropriate action in line with departmental policy to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all.

I thank the majority of our families who continue to uphold these values and contribute to a safe and supportive learning environment. Together, we set the tone for the kind of community we want our children to grow up in.

Important Safety Alert: Magnetic Balls

We wish to inform our school community about a significant safety concern regarding certain magnetic ball toys recently recalled due to serious health risks.

<u>What Are Magnetic Balls?</u> These are small, colourful, high-powered magnets often marketed as desk toys or stress relievers. Despite being labelled for adults, they can attract the attention of children due to their bright colours and interactive nature.

<u>Why Are They Dangerous?</u> If a child swallows more than one of these magnets, they can attract each other through the walls of the intestines, leading to severe injuries such as:

- Intestinal blockages
- Perforations
- Infections
- Sepsis
- Even death
