Online Behaviour & Social Media – Supporting Our Students



In our increasingly connected world, social media and online behaviour play a significant role in our students' lives—and so do the choices families make around them. As a partner in our students learning journey, I wanted to dedicate this edition of our 'Update" to highlight the upcoming changes and invite you to join us in supporting your child's online safety and wellbeing.

From 10 December 2025, new Australian legislation requires certain social media platforms to take reasonable steps to prevent users under the age of 16 from holding accounts.

Among other things, this means:

- Platforms like TikTok, Instagram, Snapchat and X (formerly Twitter) may become "age-restricted social media platforms"—meaning children under 16 should not hold accounts on them.
- The obligation lies primarily with the platforms to comply, but we know that family guidance, conversation and supervision remain essential.
- A free range of <u>resources</u> is available at the <u>eSafety Commissioner</u> website to help parents understand what safe online behaviour looks like and to help guide discussions with children.

As a school community, our goal is to support your child to use technology responsibly, respectfully and mindfully. You can help by:

- Setting clear rules and routines around screen time and social media access.
- Frequently talking about online behaviour—what is expected, what is safe, and how to respond if something feels wrong.
- Monitoring behaviour, device use and the apps your child accesses.
- Encouraging positive offline activities, hobbies and friendships to balance digital time.
- Revisiting and reinforcing platforms' privacy settings and parental controls regularly.

By working together, we can help our students navigate the digital world safely and build habits that support both their wellbeing and learning.

Please refer to the <u>frequently asked questions</u> that may provide answers to some of your immediate concerns and outline how these reforms will be rolled out, what they mean for families, and how you can best support your child online.

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Get Set for Year 7 in 2026!

Get Set for Prep in 2026!

Did you know that Prep attendance is compulsory in all Queensland schools? If your child was born between 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021, they are due to start Prep next year.

Enrolments interviews are in progress for Prep students for 2026, with our very well attended WHSC "Prep Explores" transition days already underway (final session Thurs 30 Oct). These *Prep Explorer* sessions have been absolutely wonderful, with our future Preps eagerly engaging in activities, making new friends, and getting to know their teachers and classrooms.

We believe that building readiness begins well before Prep, and these early experiences play a vital role in helping our littlest learners feel confident, connected, and excited to begin their school journey.
